



## The Experience

"Youth Ministry & Worldview" is a half-day experience designed for youth pastors, youth ministry volunteers and parents of teens. A multi-media learning encounter combining conversation, teaching, group interaction, and take-home resources, "Youth Ministry & Worldview" is a team-building experience. Your group will walk away with a deeper understanding of contemporary life, its effect on teen culture, and renewed vision for ministry.

## The Content

### **Session 1 - "Living in Two Worlds"**

In this session, we'll explore how teens (and many adults) live in two worlds: "God World" and "Everyday World." For many young people, faith is relegated to their youth group activities, feelings about God, and a set of beliefs that seem to have little bearing on the everyday. After all, what does salvation have to do with I-pods or instant messaging? As leaders, we need to understand the powerful impact the "everyday world" has on young people. And to do that, we need to understand the nature of contemporary culture.

### **Session 2 - "Connecting the Dots"**

Jesus does not ask for part of our life. He wants the whole thing! In this session, we will explore how youth ministers and parents can help young people "connect the dots" between "God World" and "Everyday World." Ultimately, our hope is to help young people discover that all of life is part of "God's World." We can do this by integrating worldview awareness into our ministry structures and family life.
